^a There are five (5) students who are assigned to the State Cohort and are not included in the sector and demographic breakdowns.

^b Graduation rates are not applicable (N/A) for the following schools due to the schools closing: Capital City Upper PCS, Maya Angelou – Shaw Campus, Spingarn, SHS, Spingarn STAY, and Transition Academy; however, the students attending these schools are included in the overall State and Sector graduation rates. Please note that Spingarn SHS had eight 3-year graduates that received a high school diploma prior to the school closing in the 2012-13 school year.

^c Graduation rates are not applicable (N/A) for E. L. Haynes PCS, Paul PCS and Richard Wright PCS for Journalism and Media Arts because these schools did not have 12th grade class yet in the 2013-14 school year. In addition, the number of students in these cohorts was suppressed (<25) due to the cohort being below the minimum n-size of 25 students; however, the students attending these schools are included in the overall State and Sector graduation rates.

^d The number of graduates and graduation rate are suppressed (DS: Data Suppression) for SEED PCS due to their cohort-size being below the minimum n-size of 25 students.

^e Graduation rates are not provided for individual non-public schools, however the 225 students attending these schools are included in the overall DCPS Cohort graduation rate.
