Between 2013 and 2015, he worked as an assistant producer and assistant director in independent feature films and documentaries in Egypt. Amin's fellowship entailed working with American University's Humanities Truck project in highlighting the work of DMV area climate change organizations through a short documentary.

"As an immigrant filmmaker and a DC resident, I am honored to be recognized by the Office of Cable Television, Film, Music and Entertainment. I'm a passionate storyteller who is always working on stories about immigrants and minorities in the DMV area."

Amin's short documentary "East of the River" just received the Best Short Documentary Award at <u>DC Independent Film Festival</u> (DCIFF) in March 2023. He has shown unparalleled passion and commitment to global change and humanity with a knack for weaving compelling stories through various mediums, with a keen eye for detail, and a passion for exploring diverse perspectives. In collaboration with DC non-profit <u>TASSC</u>, Amin's latest short documentary about pro-social advocacy for torture survivors is currently in pre-production.
